

IEPA State Revolving Fund Notification
City of Pontiac Wastewater Treatment Plant Improvements

The City of Pontiac, Illinois has recently begun the Wastewater Treatment Plant Improvements. These improvements consist of upgrading/replacing the existing aged wastewater treatment plant infrastructure, process equipment, piping, electrical, controls, and various other components throughout the treatment plant and its remote sewage lift stations.

Funding for this project is provided by a low-interest loan from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency's Water Pollution Control (WPCLP) State Revolving Fund (SRF). The SRF is administered by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and receives a portion of its money to fund these projects from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. The treatment plant improvements will allow the City of Pontiac to treat wastewater efficiently and effectively for decades to come. The improved plant will also have new capabilities of treatment, such as removing phosphorus and nitrogen to help provide cleaner waterways for its receiving streams.
